The Andrews Sisters were three mid 20th century singers who were real-life siblings. The Jacksons were real-life brothers who never called their singing group The Jackson Brothers and similarly, The

Staple *Singers* were all members of one family.

Were the Righteous Brothers related? Were the Pointer Sisters siblings? Was Sly and the Family

Stone a bona fide family?

Which pop groups were actually siblings but never used 'sisters' or 'brothers' in the band name?

And of those that did, were they really related? How and where did they form? And if the members

did not share a family name, why choose that particular moniker?

An added complication is that pop groups are notorious for having a revolving door of personnel

while keeping the band name – so any 'brothers' or 'sisters' in the title may eventually not be so

true!

To answers these questions and more, this presentation focuses on the more familiar 'brothers' and

'sisters' in pop music. The history behind these musical family members – or not – are equally as

fascinating as the performers that are forever associated with their great songs.

This lecture gives insights and backgrounds into the truths and myths of these 'related' pop singers

and will include many of their greatest hits. Be prepared to be confused by group names but enjoy
